# **BOARD OF SUPERVISORS**

### MEETING MINUTES

### REGULAR MEETING, January 21, 2020, 7:00 P.M.

The Regular Meeting of the Stroud Township Board of Supervisors was called to order by Chairwoman & Ass't Secretary, Christine A. Wilkins at 7:00 P.M., at the Stroud Township Municipal Center, 1211 North Fifth Street, Stroudsburg, Pa. Also present were Supervisor/Ass't Treasurer, Edward C. Cramer; Vice Chairwoman, Jennifer Shukaitis; Township Manager, Daryl A. Eppley; Township Solicitor, Todd Weitzmann; and Recording Secretary, Janice Willey.

**Public Comments:** (Non-Agenda Item) Residents Michael and Rosaly Franolich from 999 Metzgar Road were there to express their concerns over a neighbor's property. They feel it is being rented out as an Airbnb and do not think it is specifically zoned for that use. They have notified SARP because fireworks were being set off at all hours day and night. They wanted clarification on short term rentals and if it was allowed in their zoning district. Mr. Weitzmann said he would speak to Ms. Beers, Stroud Township Residential Zoning Officer, regarding this issue. The residents said they will call the township office the next day with contact information.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: Month of December. Mr. Eppley read the report aloud. Mr. Cramer moved to <u>accept the</u> Treasurer's Report: Month of December. Ms. Shukaitis seconded the motion. All voted aye, motion carried 3-0.

**Manager's Report:** Mr. Eppley reported there was a meeting on January 15th with PennDOT and their consultant to continue work on the Green Light-Go project. Representatives from Signal Control Products attended to review the Econolite Edaptive system. Bid specs are being put together. The grant agreement was extended until June 30, 2020. County grant of \$30,000.00 was approved for the Hamilton-Stroud-Pocono-Stroudsburg Regional Comprehensive Plan. The 2018 Municipal Recycling Grant fund check was received from DEP, which was approximately \$19,000.00. I will be meeting with DEP and Pat Calpin tomorrow to discuss the next Section 902 grant round for up to \$350,000.00. We finally received a fully-executed Multimodal Transportation Fund Grant Agreement from PennDOT which makes us eligible for reimbursement expenses towards the Mervine Bridge Replacement project. The new wheel loader has been operating at Gaunt Road. The ice rink opened today and will remain open from 7:30 am to 9 pm daily as conditions permit. Ms. Shukaitis made a motion to <u>accept the</u> Manager's Report. Mr. Cramer seconded the motion. All voted aye, motion carried 3-0.

<u>Public Works Dept. Report</u>: Douglas Walker's report stated they have completed cleaning up the debris from the last ice storm which was their main focus. The road crew is now working on tree trimming to prevent more debris from future storms. They are heading to Cherry Valley, specifically Cherry Canyon to trim out small saplings that tend to ice up and cause more trouble/damage when it hangs over the roads making it hard to pass. He is waiting for the OK to finish the cleanup at the School View Lane, Bezdzecki Property. And we are always working on Request for Action forms as the come in.

**Police Report:** Capt. Gasper reported retail thefts were high but it is not unusual for this time of year. One officer that was hired in the fall has completed the field training which is a good thing and another hire is set for the end of the month or some time in February. If there are any questions feel free to contact him.

<u>Solicitor's Report</u>: Mr. Weitzmann said he is happy to report he just received an order from Judge Zulick approving our stipulation regarding the Grant project and the Township can disperse the money from the fire escrow and that case can be closed out. Anything else I have is for executive session.

**Engineer's Report:** Mr. Eppley read from Mrs. Alker's report. She will be meeting on 1/28 with PennDOT, who is working with us to introduce DEP to the Route 447/Brushy Mountain Road intersection drainage project. The township and PennDot will receive MS4 credits. The rest of the items Mrs. Alker has in her report are ongoing SALDO projects.

**Fire Department Report:** Bill Unruh, Fire Chief, reported it was a busy year with calls being up. Total for last year was 478. Most recently was the fire in Cherry Valley, which required other departments to be called out. This is becoming more common. They are thinking about training together for this reason. He also reported the department is moving forward with the radio purchase even though they did not receive the grant. We will start with purchasing eleven P25 capable radios and the cost for those will be \$45,822.00. The department received a memo from Control Center stating they will be deleting the old CAT System and if they needed any information, such as call volumes and specific dispatches, it must be requested June 2020. Mr. Unruh asked if there were any updates on the tax incentive our members. Mr. Eppley said he did receive a draft Ordinance from Mr. Weitzmann and communicated with Mr. Philips to meet again and come up with qualifying criteria and the other thing is to see how our tax revenue comes in after the new reassessment. Mr. Unruh also asked about updates on a standby generator for the Arlington Station. Mr. Eppley said he spoke with Congressman Cartwright's staff about getting a generator from Tobyhanna Army Depot. I found out about this program from the grant writer who suggested going this route.
