# MEETING MINUTES

#### REGULAR MEETING, October 20, 2020, 7:00 P.M.

The Regular Meeting of the Stroud Township Board of Supervisors was called to order by Chairwoman & Secretary, Christine A. Wilkins at 7:00 P.M., at the Stroud Township Municipal Center, 1211 North Fifth Street, Stroudsburg, Pa.. Also present were Vice Chairwoman & Ass't Secretary, Jennifer Shukaitis; Supervisor/Ass't Treasurer Edward C. Cramer; Township Manager, Daryl A. Eppley; Township Staff Engineer, Donna Alker, P.E.; Township Solicitor, Todd Weitzmann; and Recording Secretary, Janice Willey. Mrs. Wilkins began the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance.

**Public Comments: (Non-Agenda Items).** Pat Henley had a few questions about Halloween hours and guidelines.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: Month of September. Mr. Eppley read the Treasurer's Report aloud. Ms. Shukaitis moved to <u>accept the Treasurer's Report: Month of September.</u> Mr. Cramer seconded. All voted aye, motion carried 3-0.

**Manager's Report:** Mr. Eppley reported our Safety Committee met on 9/30/2020 and our KMIT Risk Management Assessment evaluation score was higher than last year. He was contacted by PennDOT design firm regarding the Glenbrook Road bridge replacement project and the Glenbrook Road slope remediation project will be packaged in with the bridge project. The township participated in the "Pick up the Poconos" campaign and the volunteers collected over 66 bags of road-side litter. Preliminary damage assessment documents for Tropical Storm Isaiah were submitted to PEMA. The PEMA representative stated the county met the disaster aid threshold but the state did not meet the \$19.1 million for federal disaster aid. The DEP permit is still pending for Mervine Road bridge replacement project. And there is another HSPS Comprehensive Plan meeting here tomorrow night.

**Public Works Dept. Report:** Douglas Walker's report said the Road Crew has been working on the following projects; Breezy View has been paved; they finished sealing blacktop joints; he pulled trees

from McMichael Creek; leaf pick up has begun; they are focusing on battery maintenance on traffic lights; and as always they are working hard on the "Request for Action" forms as they come in.

**Police Report:** Officer Raymond reported they are proceeding with new hires. The department just completed written and physical exams. There were no assaults this past month and only 2 burglaries. Mr. Cramer asked how the Police Department will be handling the new Halloween hours for the different municipalities. He responded regularly all officers would be working for those Trick-or-Treat hours, so this year it will be longer hours they will be on.

Solicitor's Report: Nothing to report outside executive session.

**Engineer's Report**: Mrs. Alker's report stated she submitted the annual report to PADEP for the MS4 permit. She has met with the Planning Commission to review proposed amendments to the Zoning Ordinances. Still waiting for plans from Reilly Associates for the Brushy Mt. Road & Rt. 447 drainage project. Pennoni Associates is working on the as-built plans and the Notice of Termination of the NPDES Permit for St. Lukes/Rt. 611 area. And she is continuing to work on ongoing SALDO projects.

**Fire Department Report:** Tom Swope, new president of the fire company, was representing the department for tonight's meeting. He said he thought Chief Unruh would be here but he could not make it. Mr. Swope had a few questions regarding the use of Gaunt Road for some storage and training within the next few weeks. He did advise the Board the Fire Department 2020 Holiday Tree sales will be on this year. Mr. Cramer asked about the acquisition of the two properties for a new firehouse. Mr. Swope said as far as he knows it didn't go through because certain criteria that was not met. Mrs. Wilkins thanked Mr. Swope for his report and commented it's been a while since we've had a representative attend the meeting and looking forward to seeing him again.

Mrs. Wilkins said that the Board discussed personnel and litigation matters in executive session and she asked if there were any motions to come before the Board. Ms. Shukaitis made a motion to continue the 50% survivor benefit for Donna Slutter. Mr. Cramer seconded. All voted aye, motion carried 3-0. Mr. Cramer made a motion conditioned upon the outcome and receipt of a note from Bill Unruh explaining his absence and satisfies the proof of his quarantine otherwise he should be charged 5 ½ hours of sick time. Ms. Shukaitis seconded. All voted ave. motion carried 3-0. Mr. Cramer made a motion at the discretion of the Township Manager based on documentation to act on one day suspension without pay based on the outcome of his ability to provide a note satisfying his absence and his attitude towards the request for this information. Mrs. Wilkins seconded. Ms. Shukaitis abstained, motion carried 2-0. Mr. Cramer made a motion to authorize the Township Solicitor to file a complaint with regards to Victor Kholod in the Court of Common Pleas. Ms. Shukaitis seconded. All voted aye, motion carried 3-0. Ms. Shukaitis made a motion to authorize the Township Solicitor to file support of prior decision in the case of Suburban Realty. Mr. Cramer seconded. All voted aye, motion carried 3-0.

There being no further business, Ms. Shukaitis made a motion to <u>adjourn the meeting at 8:45 P.M.</u> Mr. Cramer seconded the motion. All voted aye, motion carried 3-0.
